Studio for Arts and Works - SAW - was started 18 years ago in 2005 as a dream to replicate the vitality and collaborative studio experience that many artists and makers originally experienced in college. Celebrating 10 years in its current location, SAW is more than a building — it is a community, which is loaded with potential, a space for artists to cross-pollinate, blossom, experiment and grow amongst an ever-changing group of motivated and like-minded souls that inspire and push each other to evolve their individual artistic visions.

SAW is also a building, formerly a mechanic shop - rough and ready, sustainably remodeled, and affordably priced - where all of the incredible work of this show is created. The structure itself is a living experiment in the reuse of non-precious space to serve artistic and community ideals through private investment that has created the SAW space that we see today.

As it continues to mature, the messy vitality and creative atmosphere of SAW remains palpable because every single day artists show up and lean into their ideas and artistic practice, contributing to a long history of professional creatives and creative professionals producing work at SAW.
